
Individual Report



Recently, this student took the Islamic Studies Standardized Test as part of the school's educational assessment program. This test, developed by Islamic educators who work within the Islamic school system, is designed to be similar in structure to tests administered in public and other private schools across the U.S. This test measures specific Islamic knowledge is in four critical content areas: (1) Qur'anic Studies, (2) Sirah and Hadith, (3) Aquidah, Fiqh, and Akhlaq, and (4) Islamic Social Studies. Depending on the grade level, this student may have been assessed in only two of the four areas during this school year.

To help better understand this student's achievement in each of the assessed areas, this report compares this student score to the average score achieved by students in the same grade level across the U.S. ("National Average") as well as the students in the same grade level in the school ("School Average"). The National Average has a shaded area around the score that indicates a general range in which the score falls ("Standard Deviation"). By comparing this student's score to the National Average and the School Average, you will have information regarding this student's score in the content areas as compared to students within the school and across the nation.
